What Prior Knowledge should students have?

- Vocabulary (fine and gross motor skills, thread, stitch, weave)
- What is stitching? What is weaving?
- What is a stitch.

Key Vocabulary	llary Definition	
Warp	Threads that run vertically- up and down- on a fabric.	
Weft	Threads that run side to side- left to right- on a fabric.	
Loom	A frame used for weaving yarns to make fabric.	
Stitch	A loop of yarn created by passing the needle in and out of a piece of fabric.	
Weave	Interlocking threads to make fabric.	
Texture	The feel or appearance of a material or surface.	

What Skills will students learn (Disciplinary Knowledge)

- Learn about weaving and the specific techniques.
- Learn about safe environment when weaving.
- Recognising similarities and differences between materials: texture, colour, and thickness.
- Learn about the works of Michael Brennand-Wood and Ruth Spaak.
- Practise and attempt to weave using different mediums.

What key knowledge will be taught (Substantive Knowledge)

- What is weaving?
- What techniques we must use when weaving.
- What is the meaning of warp and weft.
- Exploring the weaving work of different artists.
- Experiencing with different mediums to identify textures.
- Working in a safe environment when weaving.
