

Family Events in School for Summer




As a part of our commitment to getting families into school more regularly, we will be hosting two events for families this half term. These are as follows:

"Stay & Read" returns from Monday 22nd April to Thursday 25th April. Following your feedback, this will be happening on a termly basis. This was such a popular and beneficial event. The children loved it, we loved it and so did you! Therefore, this will have the same format as previously where we will be asking families to sign up for one of the sessions. The sessions will start at drop off (from 8.45am) and finish at 9.10am. We are asking that just one adult per child signs up due to space in the classrooms. If you have multiple children at school then there are several options for you: one adult can come in on two seperate occasions, multiple adults can sign up to multiple children (e.g. two siblings, two adults) or one adult can move between the siblings classrooms. We look forward to welcoming you and ask that you sign up <u>here</u>.

On Friday 24th May we will be hosting our very first "**VIP Picnic**" As you are aware, throughout the year there are opportunities to celebrate Mother's Day, Father's Day and Grandparent's Day. Attendance & Punctuality




A reminder to all families that our gates open at 8.45am where children are welcomed into their classrooms. During this time children are able to settle in for the day by putting away their belongings, changing their choosy books and participating in an early morning activity.

Gates will close at 8.55am sharp to allow all children time to settle before the registration at 9am. A punctual start to the day means that children are "ready to learn" and feel more settled for the day ahead.
